You and I want to be among those God will call "wise." I recall one of my journeys aboard a ship sailing along the Alaskan coast. A 21- year-old man wanted to talk with me. As we discussed his major concern over his marriage plans, I pointed Brad to the only One who could give him a foundation that would last. There with the wind and waves muting our voices, the young man called out to Jesus for forgiveness and new life. It was God's appointment, for that morning my prayer was simple: "Lord, I'm Yours. Put me where You want me and with whom You want me. Use me to carry out Your plan."

I challenge you, my fellow-disciple, to also pray that prayer as you step into every new day. The Holy Spirit will guide your steps, stops and starts in mysterious and wonderful ways as He uses your lifestyle and witness to point others to His way of righteousness. You and I may appear simple to the world, but we can be counted wise in the eyes of God by turning many in the world to Him.

"Jesus said to them, My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me, and to finish His work." John 4:34

This is not a word for the lukewarm to remain unchanged. Jesus' passion was the Father's heart - and the Father's heart is to let every person on planet earth hear the explosive news of His offer to forgive sins and grant eternal life to all who receive His Son. The whole chapter is the saga of the soul winner who understands the moment and seizes the opportunity to give life to the spiritually dead.

Jesus, along with His disciples, was bone-tired and thirsty when they sat by Jacob's well. First a drink, then a bite, were the first orders of the day for the disciples. But Jesus' orders came from deeper than the stomach and he saw a greater need than His own. They went to find food; He went in search of a hungry soul. He reached out to the woman of Samaria and ended up bringing this lost but receptive person to God's banqueting table. When the disciples returned with food and told Jesus to eat, He said in effect, "I already have." "My food (nourishment) is to do the will (pleasure) of Him who sent Me..." (Amplified Bible). And that's when He told them of a great harvest - entire fields of precious souls of all cultures, creeds and colors - needing harvesters to bring them in from the fields of sin to the heart of God. They were to first pray that God would send workers into the harvest fields, and then obey in going themselves in the direction of "others."

Where will you and I find our true food - our nourishment? If it is only in the physical and material, there can be no lasting satisfaction; only more hunger pangs. But if our "nourishment" comes from both a passion and a plan to do our part to fulfill world evangelism, the Lord of the harvest will set up those "special appointments" for you to bring others like the Samaritan woman to Him.

My Prayer: "Father, I want something that motivates me far greater than human pangs of hunger. Give me the passion of my Savior to see the lost in my world and be used to help find them and bring them to You."

"For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek."

Romans 1:16

Today's truth takes in responsibility. We know that our Lord is the great "I AM" who appeared to Moses and who walked the earth as Jesus Christ. Only He could say "I am the way...the resurrection and the life... the door...before Abraham was, I am." But when He turns old sinners into new saints, He also expects us to live out

the "I am" of responsibility to others. Paul did, and he always made himself an example to be followed. First he says, "I am debtor" (1:14), second "I am ready" (1:15), and third "I am not ashamed" (1:16).

You have been given God's gift of eternal life. Now He has made you a debtor to others. 1) You owe them the opportunity to accept the Messiah through your witness. 2) You are to be ready to share the good news. That means having an intimate relationship with Jesus and a plan of action that sees open doors to the hearts of others and seizes the moment. 3) If our walk with Jesus is lukewarm, we will be ashamed to bring Him up to Jew or Gentile. After all, He remains invisible, we speak of an invisible heaven and hell, and we believe in a life that operates by faith and not sight. To worldly intelligence, that sounds weird. But all that changes when God fills us (all who ask Him) with the fire and power of the Holy Spirit who can exert such powerful pressure and influence on any human heart that the invisible becomes more real than what is seen. He literally turns the gospel of Christ you are sharing with another into the power of God that brings salvation and new life. You would be wise to memorize Romans 1:14-16 and to make a lifetime motto: "I am debtor. I am ready. I am not ashamed."

My Prayer: "Cleanse me anew, my Lord, from sin, self and staleness. Fill me with the fire and power of the Holy Spirit and give me Your vision to reach out to Jew and Gentile. Make me ashamed only of my lukewarmness. Let me never be ashamed of the gospel of Christ."

After hours of fruitless searching, one person suggested that the group walk the field while holding hands so as to miss nothing. They finally found the little one, but she was dead. The grief-stricken father wailed: "My God, why didn't we join hands before?!"
